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Why come to this protest?

1. **Commemorate and reflect on the sixth anniversary of the US invasion of Iraq, and pressure our politicians for an end to war.** The Iraq War has been disastrous on many levels, most obviously for the people of Iraq but also for the United States. The new administration of Barack Obama, while good in some respects, unfortunately plans to leave 50,000 US troops in Iraq indefinitely and to greatly expand the US war in Afghanistan. At this crucial juncture we must stand up for peace, justice, and law.
2. **Continued war = Continued economic hardship.** The current economic crisis—including budget cuts and tuition hikes—is largely the result of our government's massive military budget. Rebuilding our economy at both the national and the state levels requires that we push the federal government and our campus administration to invest in responsible alternatives to war and militarism.
3. **Contribute to a growing movement for peace, justice, and democracy.** From foreign wars to cuts in government education spending to rising economic inequality, the Stony Brook campus has been relatively quiet in recent years about many issues that directly affect the future—our own as well as the world's. The rally March 18th is the first step in building a movement capable of addressing these and other issues. Please join us!

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
